We'll learn about one region of the world each day, including 110 special cities where many people still don't know Jesus. On Days 9 and 10, we'll also pray for big cities in the Americas and Caribbean, where people from many countries live, or where missionaries are getting ready to go share God's love.

This isn't just about praying for faraway places. God wants us to pray for our own hearts, for our neighborhoods, our state, our country, and the whole world. Why? So that His love can shine everywhere!

As you use this prayer guide, we want to help you learn how to pray.

This model is a wonderful way to teach children to pray not only for themselves, but also for others. God, our loving Father, enjoys hearing from us and loves when we pray for our own needs and for the needs of others, too. After all, we are all apart of one big family!

Thumb (people who are close to you)
These are your close friends and family—the first people you think about. Thank God for your parents, siblings, friends, and classmates. Ask God to protect them, help them know His love, and draw them closer to Him. Pray that any of them who don't know Jesus will believe in Him.

Pointer (people who point the way)
These are leaders like teachers, pastors, children's workers, and Christian missionaries. Thank God for the ways they help guide you. Ask God to strengthen them, give them wisdom, and send more helpers and missionaries to share His good news with others.

Tall Finger (people in authority and far away)
This is for people in authority. Some examples are people who work in the government, military, and police, and also for people in other countries. Ask God to give leaders wise hearts, and to send workers and missionaries to places where people have not heard about Jesus yet. Pray for God's light to reach the unreached people groups around the world and for unbelievers to come to know Him.

Ring Finger (people who are weak or forgotten)
This is your weakest finger, reminding you to pray for those who are weak, sick, poor, or treated badly for following Jesus. Also pray for children and families who have never heard about Jesus or have no chance to learn about Him. Ask Jesus to help and comfort them, bring new strength, and send loving people to share God's love with them.

Little Finger (your own needs)
God loves it when you pray for others, but He cares about you too! Talk to God about your own worries, hopes, and dreams. Ask Him to help you grow in faith and courage, so you can be part of His plan to love the whole world.

HOW TO PRAY



God loves everyone so much and really wants every person to know Him and be saved. Imagine a farmer who wants a big, good crop—God feels the same way! He wants many people to follow Him and live with Him forever.

To make this happen, God sends people to share His love and message so more hearts can be saved and grow strong in faith. Jesus asks us to pray for more people to help share His love—just like a farmer needs helpers to gather a big harvest!

Just like a kind teacher wants every student to understand and learn, God doesn't want anyone to be left in the dark. That's why He sent Jesus—to teach us about forgiveness, hope, and life that never ends. The Bible says God wants "all people to be saved and to come to know the truth" (1 Timothy 2). Jesus told His followers to share this good news with "all nations" (Mark 13).

God's dream is that one day, every person everywhere will know Him. They will be a big, loving family with no one left out. This means no matter who you are, where you live, or what language you speak, God loves you. Jesus wants His love and message to reach children and families in all cities, villages, and countries. He invites everyone to come and know Him!

That's why we pray, sing songs about Jesus, and share stories of His love. We want everyone everywhere to hear about Him and believe. First, we come close to Jesus ourselves, and then we help others do the same. Jesus came to save us, that is to rescue us from sin and give us eternal life, because God's biggest wish is that no one should be lost but that all would say "yes" to His love and live with Him forever.

Interactive Ideas for Kids

Harvest Helpers Game:

- Pretend to be farmers gathering a harvest—use toy fruits or balls, and each time you "gather," say a person or group you want to pray for (family, friends, countries, etc.). This shows how God wants helpers to share his love.

Story Chain:

- As a family or group, take turns sharing short stories or good things Jesus has done for you. Pass a ball or object to the next person as a way to "pass on" the message—showing we can all share God's love.

Dress-up and Parade:

- Have kids dress up in clothes from different countries or use scarves and hats to represent "all nations." Parade around and sing a song about Jesus' love for everyone, showing that God's family is big and diverse!

Family Art Project:

- Create a giant poster or mural titled "God's Big Family" with drawings or cut-out pictures of people from around the world. Add handprints, hearts, and Bible verses. Talk about how every person matters to God.

Mission Helper Jar:

- Make a jar with slips of paper, each listing a way to show God's love that week (helping a friend, writing a kind note, praying for someone far away, etc.). Pick one as a daily "mission" to live out God's dream.

Role-Play Scenarios:

- Act out situations where someone is new, lonely, or different, and practice ways to welcome and show God's love—so kids learn to be "good news bringers" wherever they go.

My name is Adam, and I live in Kuala Lumpur! Every morning, I wake up to the sounds of motorcycles zooming by and birds singing in the tall trees outside our apartment. Some days, I smell the yummy roti canai (flatbread) cooking at the Mamak shop downstairs, and sometimes I hear the gentle melody from the mosque nearby calling people to prayer. My city is always busy—full of tall buildings, colorful markets, and people from all over the world.

At school, I sit next to my best friend Sharvin, who celebrates Deepavali, and my other friend Mei, who celebrates Chinese New Year. Our teacher tells us about all the different festivals—Hari Raya, Deepavali, and Christmas. I love how, in Kuala Lumpur, everyone gets excited no matter whose festival it is. We get to eat special food, see lanterns and fireworks, and draw pictures about what we celebrate together.

Most people in my city are Muslims, and my family goes to church on Sundays. Sometimes I feel a bit different because I am Christian, but my parents say Jesus loves everyone and wants us to love others too, just like Him. Our church, not far from our home, is small. We sing songs together and pray for our city. I wish more people in Kuala Lumpur knew how much Jesus loves them. Some of my classmates have never heard about Him, but I can show them His kindness by being a good friend and sharing my lunch if they forget theirs.

Sometimes, people ask me why I don't do all the same things as them during certain holidays, and I tell them, "I follow Jesus! He forgives me, helps me be brave, and gives me hope." My parents remind me not to be ashamed and to pray for Kuala Lumpur. I do, every night before bed. I ask God to help everyone in my city live together in peace and to know His love.

I love living here—even when it rains so hard the streets flood and the frogs come out to play, or when the city shines at night with all the lights. My city is special because it's full of people who are different but can be friends. I hope one day, all my friends will know Jesus and His love for them, just like I do.

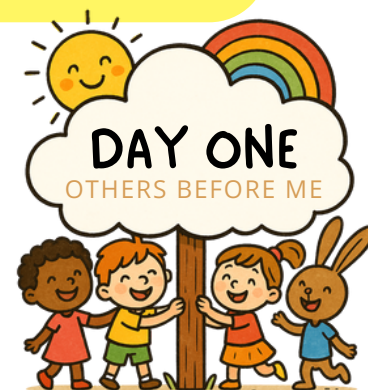
Put Feet to Your Prayers

My name is Ming, and I am nine years old. I live in Xining, a city high up on the mountains in western China, with my parents and little sister. Our apartment looks out over busy streets and faraway snow-topped hills. Every morning, I walk through the lively market on my way to school, breathing the cold, fresh air and seeing people from different cultures. There are some who wear colorful Tibetan robes, some wear white headscarves for prayers, and many look just like my family, Han Chinese.

Most days after class, I play soccer with my friends in the schoolyard. Sometimes I hear the loudspeakers call people to worship at the big mosque, and on festival days there are lines of people visiting the temples, burning incense or spinning prayer wheels. My grandma sometimes takes me to Buddhist temples, and she tells me stories about kindness. My best friend, Tenzin, is Tibetan. His family goes to the monastery during special festivals, bringing offerings and singing songs. We all eat noodles or lamb skewers for lunch, crowded around tiny tables in the market.

There are not many Christians in Xining. I heard from my dad that if you look hard, there are small churches where people quietly meet and read about Jesus. Once, my mom brought home a small Bible hidden in her bag. She whispered, "We pray at home because not everyone understands about Jesus here."

Sometimes, on Sundays, we close our curtains, sing soft songs, and pray for Jesus to help our neighbors and friends know His love. She says Jesus came to show us the greatest love, to forgive, and to bring hope to everyone. He can for people to know Him even in Xining.

At school, nobody talks about Jesus. I pray in my heart, "Jesus, please visit my city. My friends don't know about You. Please help them see Your kindness and find peace." My mom says we should be brave and gentle, like Jesus was, and help others, even if they believe different things. When friends are sad, I try to share or be kind, hoping that makes them wonder why. Sometimes I wish I could tell them that Jesus loves them, but I have to be careful.

Walking home, sometimes I see groups of people prostrating or bowing in prayer, or hear monks chanting by the monastery gates. My city is full of faith, but many people do not know Jesus at all. Mom says that even a little light can shine in the darkness. So we pray for the city and shine the light of Jesus how He shows us.

Lord, Thank you for making me special and always knowing me (Psalm 139:13). Thank you for working in my heart, helping me do what is right (Philippians 2:13), and for your Holy Spirit, who guides me (John 16:13).

I praise you because Jesus prays for me, so I am never alone (Hebrews 7:25). I love you, God! I'm glad to be your child.

"And the things you have heard me say in the presence of many witnesses entrust to reliable people who will also be qualified to teach others." 2 Timothy 2:2 NIV.

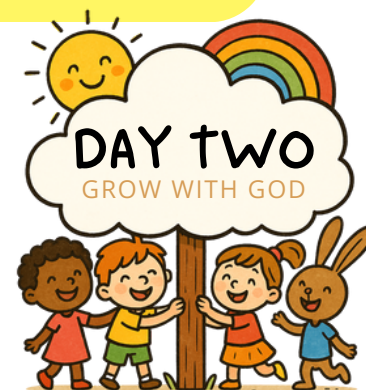
Today You Can:

My name is Ayaan, and I am 10 years old. I live with my family in a small house near the Dal Lake in Srinagar, India. Our city is surrounded by beautiful mountains, and every morning I hear the azaan, the Muslim call to prayer, echoing across the rooftops.

Most of my neighbors are Muslim, like us, though my Amma tells me there are also Hindus, some Sikhs, and even a few Christians in Srinagar. On Eid, our streets are full of people in bright clothes, hugging each other and eating sweet breads. Sometimes we visit the grand mosques, like the Hazratbal Shrine, or see pilgrims on their way to the Hindu temple on Shankaracharya Hill.

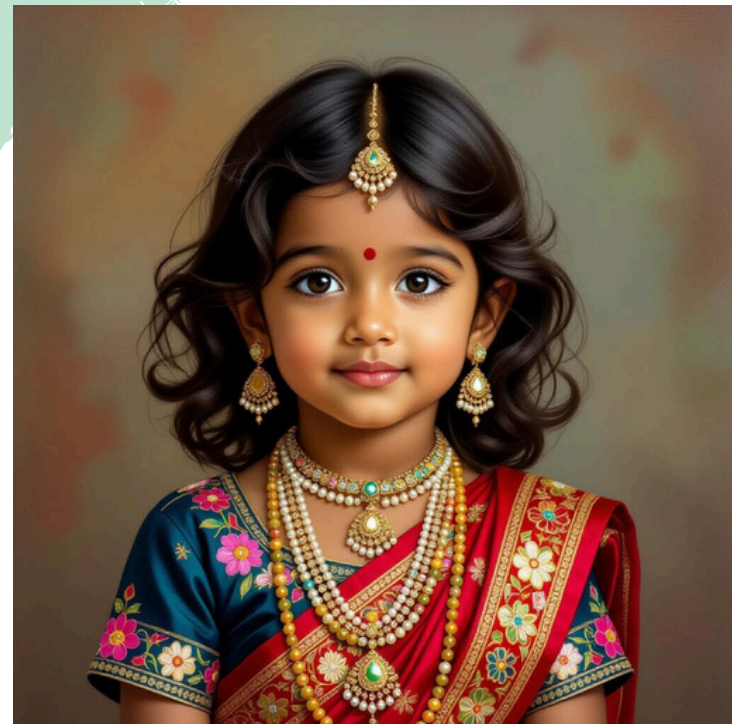
Every day before school, Amma reminds me to speak softly and pray for peace, because Srinagar does not always feel peaceful. Soldiers and bunkers are everywhere, and sometimes we are not allowed to go out if there are troubles. Once, my friend Arjun told me that his family prays at home because they are Hindu and wish for everyone to get along. Sometimes I wonder why, with so many religions, people cannot be kinder to each other.

I often walk past the churches too, like the Holy Family Catholic Church near Lal Chowk. It looks very old, with a tall cross on top, but only a few families go there because there are not many Christians in Srinagar. Most people have never even heard about Jesus except as a prophet in Islam.

One day, I heard from a Christian teacher in our class who told us a story about how Jesus loves everybody in the world, even those who don't know Him yet. She said Jesus can bring real peace, not just in our city, but in

our hearts. She told us to pray for everyone, not just our own families. It made me think: so many here know about Allah or the Hindu gods, but very few know about Jesus as the Savior, the One who forgives and brings hope. There are churches, but sometimes people are afraid to go or do not want to listen because they think it is not for them.

Sometimes I wish more people in Srinagar could hear about Jesus and know His love. Life is hard and uncertain, and even when we have celebrations, we are always careful. I hope that one day, all my friends, whether they are Muslim, Hindu, Sikh, or Christian, can know the love, forgiveness, and peace that only Jesus can give. I pray quietly, asking Jesus to shine His light here, so Srinagar can be a place of hope for everyone.

Talk To God

My name is Arian, and I am eight years old. I live with my family in a small apartment in Tehran, the biggest city in Iran. When I wake up, I hear the call to prayer echoing from the mosque near our home. My mama wraps her scarf and makes breakfast, bread, cheese, and sometimes a bit of honey. Baba goes early to work, and my older sister gets ready for school like me. The city is always busy, cars honking, people selling things, and street vendors calling out. Sometimes, I see other kids my age selling flowers or shining shoes. Some of them are not from Iran, but from Afghanistan, like my friend Ali, who can't go to school and must work to help his family.

Every Friday, the city feels quieter. My family visits Grandma. She tells me stories from when she was a girl long ago, before so many rules. We celebrate Nowruz and other holidays, and Mama helps me learn to pray like a good Muslim, because here, most people are Shia Muslims and follow their traditions every day. We learn about the prophets and the great Imam, and I hear that people are waiting for the twelfth Imam to return and make everything better. At school, our teacher asks us about the Quran, and we recite verses. My friends and I try to behave, because we're taught God is watching.

But sometimes, I feel something is missing. I see sadness on the streets, kids who are sick or can't read, and families who worry about food. Sometimes Mama looks tired and worried too, and Baba prays for better times.

I once met a neighbor who whispers about Jesus. She says He loves everyone and can change hearts, even when things are hard. But people are afraid to talk about it openly; I heard it could get you in trouble. Some say there are churches hidden in the city, and people who meet to pray to Jesus, hoping for peace and real hope in their lives.

Sometimes, I dream of knowing a love that is big and warm and feels close, like what I hear in the stories about Jesus. I wonder what it would be like if everyone in my city knew Him. Maybe there would be less sadness, and more hope for the kids on the streets and in my school. I pray quietly for God to show me the truth and for my friends—Ali, Ladan, and the street kids, to find joy and feel loved, too. Maybe one day, Tehran will be a city where everyone knows real peace and the love of Jesus.

Talk To God

"Sing to God, sing praises to his name; lift up a song to him who rides through the deserts; his name is the Lord; exult before him!" Psalm 68:4 NIV

1. Pray that as Jesus followers sing worship to Him, that darkness hides and hearts open to Jesus' goodness and love.
2. Please pray for people who are having a hard time because they are doing what is right. Pray for Christians who are suffering for believing in Jesus. Ask God to help them be brave and keep going. Pray that they can even love and forgive those who are not kind to them. Trust that God will keep them safe and help them.

Put Feet to Your Prayers

"Rescue those being taken off to death, and save those stumbling toward slaughter. If you say, "But we didn't know about this," won't He who weighs hearts consider it? Won't He who protects your life know? Won't He repay a person according to His work?" Proverbs 24:11-12

Knowing God intimately is true life and we are called to make Him known to others with urgency.

- Practice 5-10 Minutes of Listening to the Lord without speaking, distractions, or noises
- Ask God to point out 5 people you know who do not yet follow Jesus; record their names and pray for them daily during 10 Days, looking for times you can tell them about Jesus' love.
- The biggest gaps in the fulfillment of the Great Commission are represented by the Frontier People Groups; choose one Frontier People Group to pray for daily

WORSHIP SONG:

HERE I AM TO WORSHIP



My name is Sami, and I live in Beirut, Lebanon. Every morning, I wake up to the muezzin's call from the mosque down the street. Sometimes the church bells ring too. My family is Christian, and we quietly pray before breakfast, asking Jesus to protect us and bless our day.

Most of my friends at school are Muslim or Druze, and it's normal for people here to have different faiths. In Beirut, it's allowed to be Christian, and we can go to church, celebrate Easter and Christmas, and talk about Jesus with our families. But Mama always reminds me to be gentle when I talk about my faith, especially outside or at school, because not everyone understands.

My parents grew up as Christians here, but they say some people who become Christians from other religions have a really hard time, even from their own families.

At school, I sometimes get strange looks when I mention Sunday school. The teachers want us to get along, but I can tell it's not always easy. Sometimes, grown-ups whisper about families that stopped talking after someone became a Christian. I want my friend Mahmoud to know Jesus, but Mama tells me just to show him kindness and pray for him. She says that's the safest way. During soccer games, I silently ask Jesus to help Mahmoud feel God's love, even if I can't talk about church much.

On Sundays, we carefully make our way to church. We don't always tell everyone where we're going. Our church is full of families like mine, and we pray for our neighbors, asking God to protect everyone in Beirut.

The priest reminds us to share Jesus's love through our actions, not just our words, because some people don't want to hear about Him and might get angry if we're too open.

At night, as I look out at the city lights, I pray, "Jesus, please help Beirut know your hope and peace. Watch over the people who feel alone because they follow you. Thank you that we can worship you, even if it's sometimes hard or risky." My faith is a quiet but strong part of life here, and I hope one day everyone in my city can talk about Jesus without fear, and know His love.

By praying for the peace of Jerusalem, we not only ask for the protection of the city and its inhabitants, but we also pray for the fulfillment of God's promises and the coming of Jesus, our Messiah. 1. Practice 5-10 Minutes of Listening to the Lord without speaking, distractions, or noises
2. 10 Days happens during a special time in the Hebrew calendar called the Days of Awe. Use these days to think about your heart, say sorry for wrong things, and let God help you be closer to Him. This is a chance to learn from the Bible about saying sorry and making good choices.
3. Ask God to show you real ways to show love and kindness to Arab, Jewish, and Israeli people near you. Then, do what God puts in your heart to help and be a friend to them.

My name is Faduma, and I live with my family in Mogadishu, the big city by the Indian Ocean. Every morning, I wake up early to the sound of the call to prayer coming from many mosques in our neighborhood. Almost everyone I know is Muslim, and following Islam is a very important part of life here. I see women in hijabs, and my friends at school all talk about what they are learning at madrasa.

But in my heart, I know Jesus. My parents became Christians before I was born, and now we follow Him, though we have to keep it a secret. We cannot let anyone know, not even my best friend, Asha. My parents tell me about Jesus when we are alone at home, and sometimes, quietly, we read from a small Bible my mom keeps hidden. We pray that God would keep us safe and protect us from people who would be angry if they knew about our faith.

It is not easy to be a Christian in Mogadishu. I cannot talk about Jesus, and we cannot gather with other Christians openly. My parents say there are some other believers in the city, but everyone must be very careful. I have heard of families who had to run away because people found out they loved Jesus. Some Christians have been hurt or worse, just because they believed in Him.

Sometimes, I feel afraid. I want to tell my friends about Jesus and His love, but I know it could bring trouble to my whole family. Instead, I ask Jesus to

help me be kind and loving, to forgive others, and to be brave when I feel alone. I pray for my city, for my friends, and for all the children who have never heard about Jesus. I pray that one day people in Mogadishu will be able to learn about Him and experience His peace.

At night, as I look out of our small window and see the city lights, I pray quietly, "Jesus, please watch over all your children here. Help us to know you more. Change the hearts of people in Somalia so everyone can know your love, and please keep my family safe." My life is different from many other children, but Jesus is always with me, and that makes me hopeful even on hard days.

My name is Issa, and I live in N'Djamena, the busy capital city of Chad. The streets here are full of motorbikes, colorful taxis, and little shops where people sell mangoes, bread, and sweet tea. Every morning, I help my mother draw water from the well while the sun rises over our dusty neighborhood.

Most of the people around us are Muslims. I see many men wearing long robes and women in bright headscarves going to the mosque. Ramadan is very important here. When the call to prayer comes from the loudspeakers, everything stops, and people pray facing Mecca. My family is different, we are Christians. We pray quietly at home and go to a small church with other believers on Sundays. Our church is hidden behind a wall, and we don't sing very loud because some people in our city get angry if they hear us talk about Jesus.

Sometimes the other children at school tease me for not joining in Muslim prayers, and I feel left out during the big festivals. Once, my friend's father told him not to talk to me anymore because I believe in Jesus. My parents remind me that Jesus loves everyone, even the people who don't like us. They say it's important to forgive and pray for those who hurt us. We have to be very careful who we tell about our faith because some Christians have even been threatened or hurt for following Jesus.

Life is not always easy for us. My father lost his job last year because someone found out he was a Christian. Still, when we pray together at night, I feel God's peace. I ask Jesus to keep us strong and help the people of N'Djamena know His love and light.

Many here have never heard about Jesus and think Christianity is just for foreigners. I pray that one day they will know He came for everyone.

Even though it is hard sometimes, I know Jesus is with me. I remember how our pastor says, "Blessed are those who are treated badly for doing what is right." I ask God every day to help me shine His light, so that maybe one day, my whole city will know the hope and love of Jesus, just like I do.

My name is Sara, and I live in Gaziantep, a busy and colorful city in Turkey. Gaziantep is famous for its yummy food, like crunchy baklava made with sweet honey and crunchy pistachios, and spicy kebabs that fill the air with delicious smells. Every day, I walk to school with my little brother, and we pass by old stone churches where some families like ours come to pray quietly.

Our city is full of history. There are old castle walls and ancient markets called bazaars, where people sell shiny copper pots, beautiful carpets, and handmade lanterns that glow at night. Sometimes, near the markets, I see women wearing colorful scarves and hear people speaking Turkish, Kurdish, and Arabic. There are many languages spoken here because lots of different people live together in Gaziantep.

Being a Christian here is not always easy. Sometimes, people don't understand our faith, and we have to be careful when we talk about Jesus. At home, when the call to prayer rings out from the mosques, I remember how Jesus loves us very much and gives us courage to keep going, even when things are hard. Sometimes, my father whispers prayers for our family's safety, especially because not everyone in our city is kind to Christians. Some neighbors look at us differently because we follow Jesus, and sometimes we hear unkind words. But Jesus teaches us to love and forgive, even when it's difficult.

I like to pray that God will help the people in Gaziantep to know His love. I pray that one day everyone will understand that Jesus brings peace and hope. I want to be brave like the heroes in the Bible who lived for Jesus, even when they faced hard times.

My favorite moment each week is when our small church family gathers to sing songs and pray. We feel close to Jesus, and His Holy Spirit helps us trust Him no matter what happens. I know Jesus watches over us and wants everyone in my city to be safe and happy.

Even though we face challenges, I believe God's love is bigger than anything. I want to help others see that Jesus is the true friend who never leaves us, no matter where we live – whether in busy Gaziantep or anywhere else in the world.

My name is Mateo, and I live in Buenos Aires, the biggest city in Argentina. Every morning, I wake up to the sound of honking cars and people talking as they hurry through our busy streets. Our city is filled with tall buildings, wide avenues, and cozy neighborhoods called “barrios.” I love riding my skateboard on the smooth sidewalks, passing by old trees and colorful murals painted on the walls.

In Buenos Aires, we eat yummy food like empanadas (pastries stuffed with meat and cheese), sweet medialunas (croissants), and, on Sundays, my family makes asado—the best barbecue—where we grill sausages and beef outside and share stories. After school, my friends and I sometimes visit the park to play fútbol (soccer). Almost everyone here loves fútbol, and the city comes alive on game days when the fans cheer for their teams with drums and songs.

Buenos Aires has beautiful churches, some very old with huge stone walls and stained-glass windows that shine with sunlight. On the streets, you’ll see statues of heroes and big fountains in the plazas. The famous Obelisco stands tall in the middle of the city, and people gather there whenever there’s something to celebrate.

I go to a small church with my family every week. We sing songs to Jesus and pray together, even though not everyone in Buenos Aires believes in Him. Some people think it’s strange that we talk about Jesus so much. A few kids at school laugh at me for being a Christian, and sometimes I hear grownups say things that make it hard for Christians to live their faith.

Once, someone spray-painted mean words on our church’s outside wall. My parents tell me there are

places in Argentina where Christians aren’t treated kindly if they leave other religions, and sometimes they feel alone or afraid.

But my Sunday school teacher says that Jesus loves every person in Buenos Aires and wants everyone to know His peace. She tells us that, even when we feel left out or teased, Jesus is with us and gives us courage. I pray for my city, asking God to help people see that Jesus can bring hope to families who are sad or worried. My grandma always reminds me, “Mateo, love your friends and pray for anyone who isn’t kind to you, just like Jesus taught us.”

I want all the children in Buenos Aires to know that following Jesus means having a true friend who never leaves you, even when things are tough. Sometimes, when I share about Jesus, I feel scared, but I remember that God is always with me in this busy, beautiful city. I hope one day everyone here will know the love of Jesus, especially those who feel alone or afraid just for believing in Him.

My name is Emily, and I live in Dallas, Texas. Dallas is a city that feels huge with its tall buildings, busy highways, and all kinds of people from different places. Every morning, I ride the yellow school bus past big churches with tall crosses, and sometimes I see people dressed up for work or wearing cowboy boots and hats, which is totally normal here!

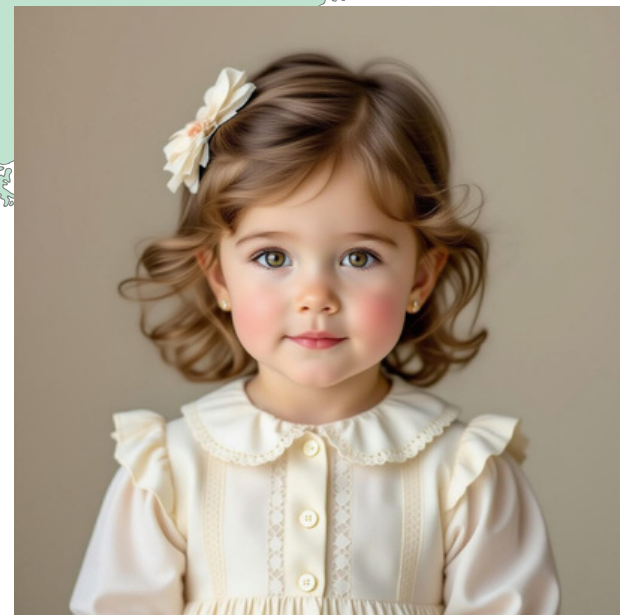
In Dallas, there are so many fun things for kids. My family and I love going to the Dallas Arboretum, where you find pretty gardens, splash pads for hot days, and amazing playgrounds shaped like rockets. On weekends, we sometimes have picnics with brisket sandwiches or go to the Perot Museum to see dinosaur bones, try science experiments, or just ride the big glass elevator and look out over downtown. A lot of people in Dallas love sports. We enjoy soccer, football, and especially cheering for the Dallas Cowboys. On game days, everyone wears blue and silver and gathers with friends and family to watch the game while eating snacks like chips and salsa or pigs in a blanket, which are mini hot dogs. We also eat Tex-Mex food like tacos and quesadillas, and in the summer, snow cones taste extra yummy.

But being a Christian in Dallas is special too. There are lots of churches, and nearly everyone I know has been to Sunday school or church camp. My family goes to church every week, and I have friends. We pray together, sing worship songs, and learn Bible stories. Even though there are lots of Christians in Dallas, some people just go to church or say they're Christian but don't really love or follow Jesus. I know kids who get teased for talking about Jesus at school or wearing Christian shirts, and sometimes adults say it's not polite to talk about God outside of church.

My parents tell me that being a true Christian means loving Jesus and others bravely and kindly, even when it's hard or people don't agree with us.

There are also kids and families in Dallas who really need Jesus. The children feel alone even with so many people nearby, and some have a hard time because of problems at home or in the city. My Sunday school teacher tells us we can help by showing kindness, sharing what we have, and praying for our neighbors. Sometimes, we make cards or donate food for children who don't have enough.

Every day, I try to remember that Jesus is with me. I try to remember while I am at school, at the playground, or when I'm with my family. Even though, Dallas is a big place, but God's love is even bigger! I hope more people here will learn about Jesus and see that He gives hope, peace, and a true friend who never leaves them, no matter what.

Here are actionable follow-up steps for a child after spending ten days praying for different unreached people groups. They can continue to be a missionary right where they are and to keep walking closely with God:

How to Stay a Missionary in Their Space

- **Tell Others What You Learned:** Share stories or facts about the different people groups you prayed for with family, friends, Sunday school, or classmates. This can inspire others to care and pray, too.
- **Pray Regularly for the World:** Keep a prayer journal or world map and choose a new country or people group each week to pray for. Invite your family to join you.
- **Care for People Nearby:** Look for kids at school or in your neighborhood who might feel left out, are new, or who are different. Show kindness, invite them to play, and be a good friend. This is a way to be a missionary every day.
- **Be Helpful at Home:** Practice serving others, just like Jesus did. You can help with chores, encourage your siblings, or do kind things for parents. Even simple acts of love make a difference and show God's love in action.
- **Write or Draw Letters:** Make a card, picture, or note to send encouragement to missionaries your church knows or to someone who needs a smile.

Walking with God Every Day

- **Daily Prayer:** Talk to God each day. You can say thank you, tell Him what's on your mind, and pray for people near and far away.
- **Read or Listen to Bible Stories:** Spend a little time each day reading the Bible or listening to Bible stories. Ask your parents or use a storybook Bible. Listen for God talking to you. God will talk to you.

- **Sing and Worship:** Sing songs about Jesus, even on your own. Music helps your heart remember God's goodness.
- **Ask Questions:** Whenever something confuses you about God or the world, ask a parent, pastor, or teacher. Questions help you grow!
- **Be Grateful:** Try to thank God for three things each day. Gratitude keeps your heart close to God.

More Actionable Steps

- **Learn More:** Visit the library or look online (with an adult) for videos or books about different cultures. Learning helps you see how big God's world is!
- **Pray for Missionary Kids:** Ask your church or parents if they know any missionary families and pray for their children specifically.
- **Invite Others to Pray:** Organize a prayer time with friends or your Sunday school, choosing new unreached groups or needs each month.
- **Memorize Scripture:** Pick one Bible verse about God's love for the world (like John 3:16 or Matthew 28:19-20) and try to memorize it as a reminder of the mission.
- **Give or Support:** Use allowance or do a fundraiser (like a lemonade stand or craft sale) to collect money to send Bibles, books, or help missionaries serve others.
- **Be a Good Example:** Remember, small acts of kindness, respect, and honesty at home, school, and everywhere are a powerful way to show Jesus to others.
